One of the beauties of the Psalms is that they share emotion. The Psalms are not story, they are poetry and full of emotion. The psalmists wrestle with God as they look at injustice in the world, they plead with him for mercy, they rejoice in his goodness, his deliverance and in his presence. They cry out for action, for justice and for mercy.

Reading the Psalms can at times feel like reading someone's journal, but they are also songs, designed to be sung. The Psalms can be beautiful and awful.

But as you read the Psalms, I want to encourage you to see how Jesus fulfills them all. He is the one who cried out concerning injustice and deals with it, he is the one who brings mercy, he is the one who cried out for deliverance and delivers, he is the one who acts for our good.

And as we see that, we may also see that Jesus experienced the full range of human emotion for our sakes, and to redeem our human emotions. Like everything else in us, emotions are good, they're just scarred by sin.

I hope you enjoy seeing Jesus in the Psalms.
